Advocacy

Governor Launches his Workforce Council

On November 21 Governor Lamont held the first meeting of his new Workforce Council to oversee the planning and development of efforts to better meet the demands of the state's economy. Whereas the previous advisory council (CETC) was focused more on the labor supply side of the issue, the new council will take its direction from the "demand" side of employers and the jobs that they need to have filled. **A key statistic is that by 2025, 70% of the jobs in the state will require education beyond a high school diploma.** Meeting that demand will, in turn, require more than just what current high school and college populations can produce; that level of demand will require adults without diplomas and those already in the workforce (incumbent workers) to improve academic skills as they train for the jobs that will pay a sustaining wage. **Adult education is an important piece in satisfying that employment demand.**

To have a workforce development plan developed and ready by this coming July, the Council will appoint six committees. Three committees will focus on three job growth sectors - manufacturing, health services and the general "white collar" area of finance, IT and business management. Three other committees will focus on education, data and general council support. The Office of Policy and Management will oversee the committee work. A Council website is still being developed.

CAACE will be keeping its members informed as the Council's work develops. In the meantime, it's critical that adult education providers stay connected to their area American Job Centers and also take a look at the "employers" section of the www.cthires.com website to learn about the job demands and training opportunities in their local and regional areas.

CAACE Strategic Survey Summary

This fall, CAACE broadly distributed a strategic planning survey to its membership to determine the priorities for its activities and development going forward. The responses to the survey represented a wide range of constituents and reflected an overall positive assessment of CAACE's engagement with and representation of the field of adult education in CT. Survey responses indicate that new initiatives (such as marketing and the newsletter) have been embraced by the field and long-standing efforts (such as the conference and quarterly PD) continue to be valued as important elements of CAACE's activities. The responses indicate that CAACE should continue to focus on the conference and professional development connected to core program content while offering increased opportunities for networking. Additionally, respondents supported intentional expansion and diversification of CAACE's membership, leadership and conference presentations
